

"It is also a good idea to watch out for fresh signs of bear activity.



Roger, K7RXV, came back from the Air Force, they became partners.





After a brief visit on Dec 2nd to the hospital with an irregular heartbeat Bob, KB7MPC's Melba, is back home and has Bob on a short leash.



Are you ULS-ready?

Most Amateur Radio licensees have yet to register with the FCC's Universal Licensing System. The ULS Task Force reports that, as of mid November, 682,212 amateurs have still not registered. This figure includes individuals whose licenses have lapsed but remain in the two year grace period. The FCC recently said approximately 3% of U.S. licensees had registered with the ULS.

Amateurs must be registered in the ULS in order to file applications with the FCC, including renewals, modifications and vanity call sign requests.

The ULS Task Force also wants amateur applicants to know that if they apply to early for license renewal, their applications will be dismissed. A license renewal must be filed no sooner than within 90 days of expiration, even if coupled with a license modification. This is only an issue for those filing paper applications; the electronic filing system will not let applicants file prematurely.

To register for the ULS, visit www.fcc.gov/ulsandclickon"TIN/CallSign Registration." Paper registration also is possible. For more information, call toll-free 888-CALL-FCC (225-5322). —ARRL Letter. See page 6 for HUY's helps.



Gerry's Fudge Recipe

FCC restructures: Three license classes, one code speed.

The FCC has issued its long awaited Report and Order on Amateur licensing restructuring. The bottom line is that starting April 15, 2000 there will be three license classes—Technician, General and Amateur Extra—and a single Morse code requirement—5 WPM.

Starting April 15, 2000, individuals who qualified for the Technician class license prior to March 21, 1987, will be able to upgrade to General class by providing documentary proof to a Volunteer Examiner Coordinator, paying an application fee, and completing FCC form 605.



The FCC decided to lump Technician and Tech Plus licenses into a single licensee database, all designated as "Technician" licensee. Those who can document having passed the 5 WPM Morse code examination will continue to have the Current Tech Plus HF privileges. The FCC said it may request documentation from a licensee or VEC to verify whether a licensee has passed a telegraphy examination.

Elimination of the 13 and 20 WPM Morse code requirements means an end to physician certification waivers for applicants claiming an inability to pass Morse code due to physical handicap.




own beef, pork, sheep and poultry, I would become a vegetarian.
