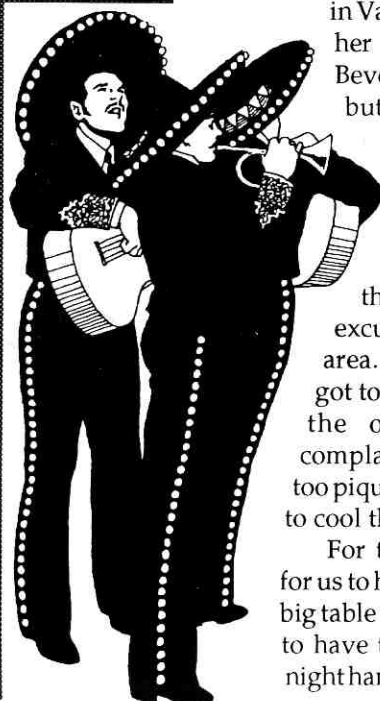

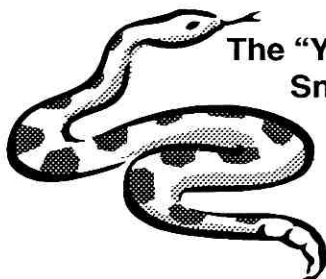

We were very saddened to learn of the passing of our "Big Mouth Engineer" on February 16 of cancer at the age of 75. It was a call from Bob, K7EPE, on President's Day that alerted me to his obituary that appeared in The Oregonian.

A funeral Mass was held on Wednesday, February 21, in St. Aloysius Catholic Church in Estacada.

Kent was an active ham for years. He was a Western County Cousins, a member of the Dip Sea Net, and other Ham groups. After his retirement, he enjoyed wood working, carving and painting. He made a significant contribution to our cookie jar at an annual picnic held at Champoeq State Park. Many of his works are in the hands of older Dipsea netters.

At that time his beloved "Jeannie," was quite ill and we thought she might have passed away. He disappeared from our net and we thought she might have passed away.

Kent was born April 25, 1925 in San Diego. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II in Europe and North Africa. He attended Brigham Young University in

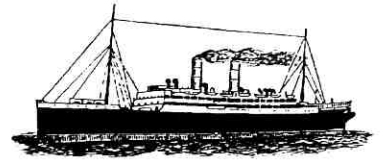


Kent Taylor, K7BME 1925-2001

He moved to Estacada in 1989, and was a member of the Church. In 1945, he married his beloved Virginia "Jeannie" Hellerschmid.

Survivors include his wife; son, Kent Jr.; sister, Polly Burnham; and three grandchildren.

Interment is in Willamette National Cemetery. The family suggests remembrances to the C.C.D. program at his church.

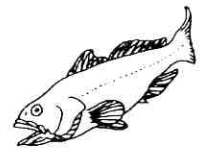

Wally Aufferman, KD7IEE

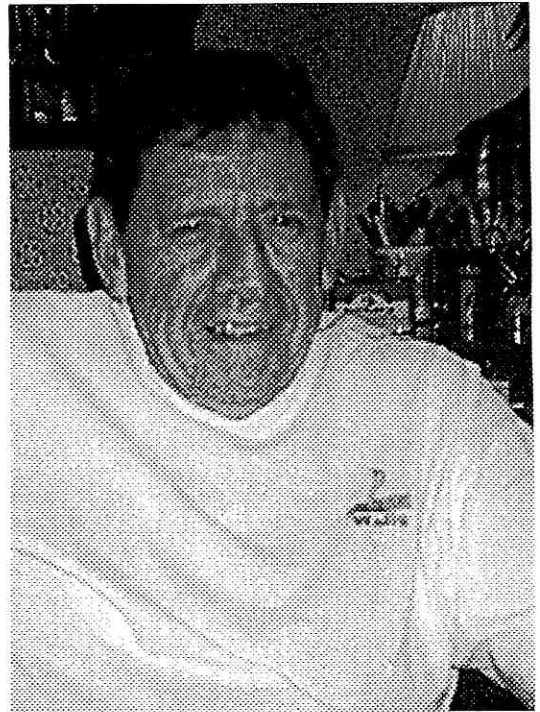
Dateline: Flushing, Long Island, New York - 21 October 1926 You guessed it - this town rejoiced at the arrival of one KD7IEE.

This bright event took place in Flushing Hospital, delighting my folks no end (I hope).

Oh, well!! Whatever. Anyhow, went thru parochial school and about three years of high school before I started bugging my folks to let me join the Navy. Being only 17 I needed parents consent. Finally got it and on one evening in May 1944 I saw my Dad cry for the first time - this as he put his little (6' 2") "Sonny Boy" on the troop train headed for boot camp up in Sampson, N.Y.

Boot camp then was a quick indoctrination into naval terminology - port & starboard - fore and aft - topside & below decks - nice descriptions of food - and of course the Quite a four week tour for a 17 year old who'd never been away from home! After boot camp I went thru signalman school (visual communications) and then assigned to a radar picket destroyer - USS Henry W. Tucker. Put her into commission at Port Orange, Texas - went on a shakedown cruise to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and from there over into Japanese waters. Spent the next several months cruising the Rykuyus group of Japanese Islands checking the troop ships bringing home their "warriors". After that, home to San Diego and discharge in May of 1946. Fortunately for me I guess, had no part in any hostilities.

After being discharged from active duty I stayed in the reserves, got a job with PanAm airlines for a year, then worked for the International Paper Company in New York. I couldn't hack civilian life so in May 1948 I reenlisted in the Navy and put in a total of twenty two years retiring in May of 1967. I spent time on aircraft carriers (USS Philippine Sea and USS Wasp - (two years each) and on



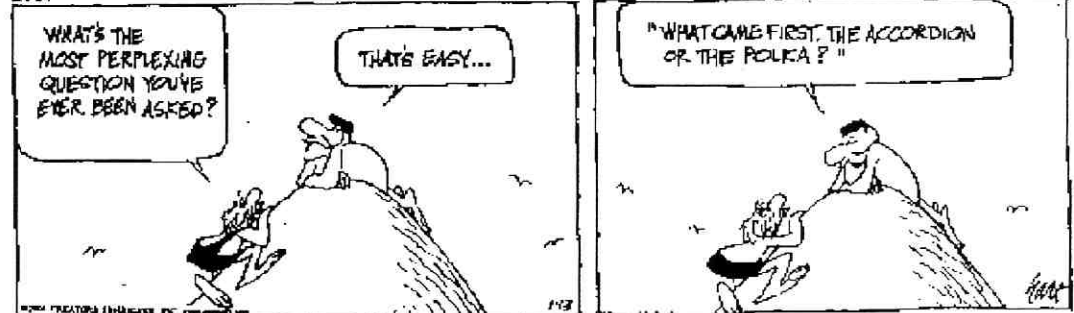
another destroyer, the USS Ault. These ships took me to the Arctic Circle and the Mediterranean. My last tour was on a destroyer escort, the USS Peterson. On the Pete I made a Deep Freeze cruise down to the Antarctic and in '62, we were one of the first ships on station for the Cuban blockade. In '63 got transferred to Colorado Springs, Colorado and spent my last three years recruiting for the Navy. I guess of the 22 years in the service about 17 years were spent on sea duty.

The biggest tragedy in my life was losing Polly, my wife of some 30 years. Lost her to a heart attack in 1986 and can't say my life has ever returned to normal.

My neighbor got me into ham radio in 1969. Didn't bother with it again until the late 90's when this "nut" comes up to my house and tells me that my garage door opener is messing up his ham radio operations. This "nut" as you may guess, turned out to be W7TMI. Got my license again, joined the Dipsea net and am still enjoying all this and especially meeting more and more of the Dipsea netters.

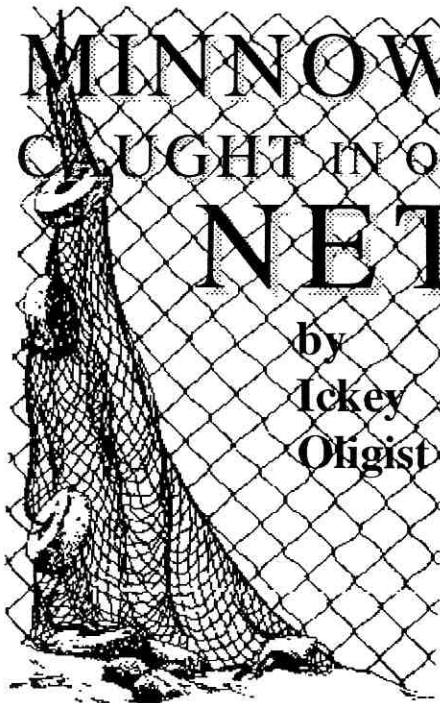

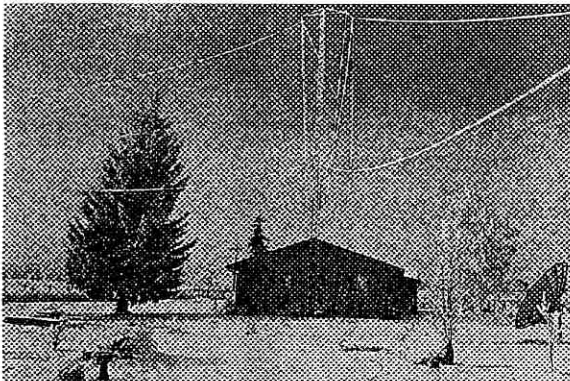
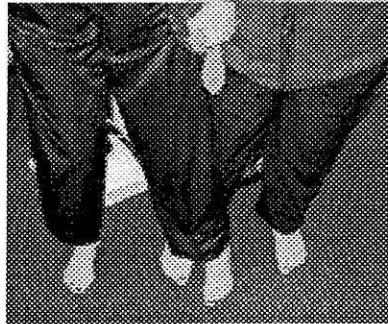


Bailey. This time she went to Ireland and had a great time. We'll have a detailed story and pictures in the next issue.

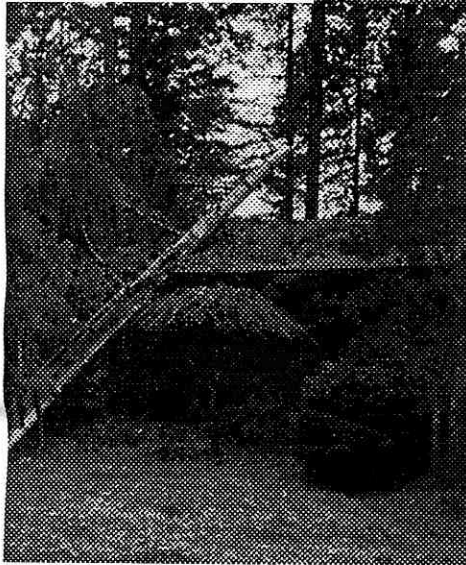
Just a little snow at Walt's place in Mechem, OR

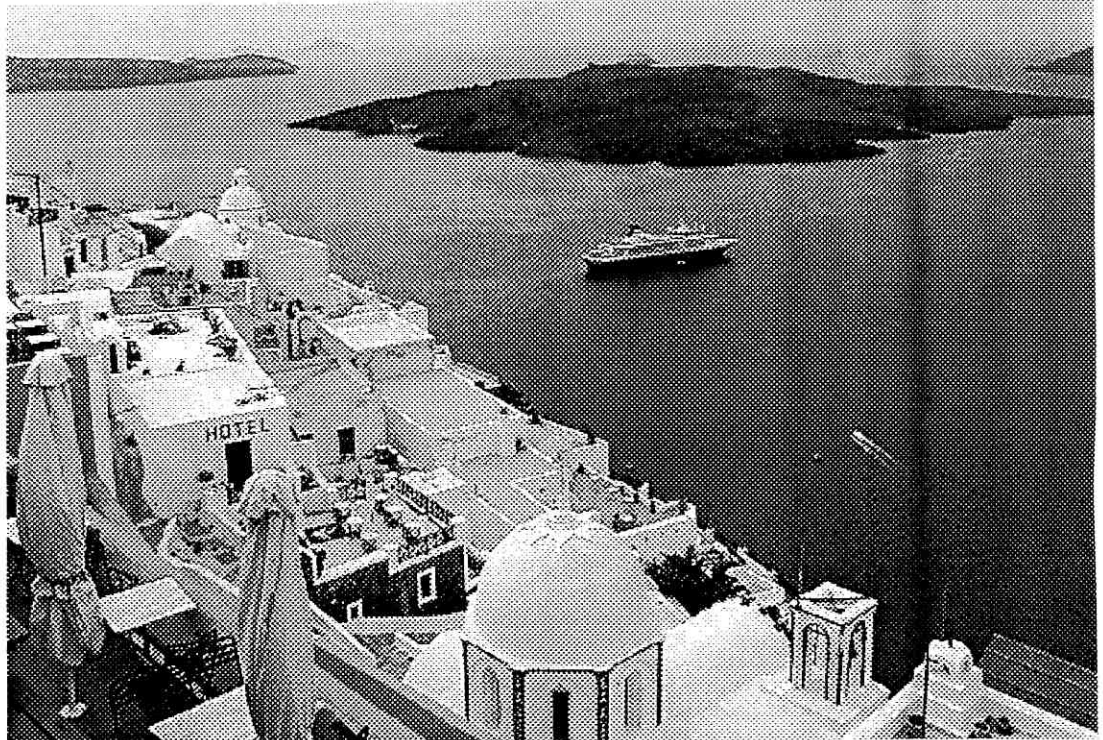

After 16 hours flying time from Portland and snoozing away as we flew over the Atlantic, most of Europe, I arrived to a sunny Athens, Greece. The airport seemed very small in comparison with other European international airports. Athens is such a crowded city, "3 million people and 2 million cars, Tour guides joke, that I can't imagine the congestion when hordes of people arrive for the Olympics.

My first view of the Acropolis was awesome, even in my sleepy, disheveled state! Because I had only 2 days in Athens I wanted to see as much as I could and signed up for the Greek dinner/folk entertainment evening and an all-day tour of Delphi. The bus driver delivered us to the ship docked at Pireaus after the tour. The Greek dinner was held at a restaurant, about an hour's bus ride from the hotel. We were met with generous glasses of Ouzo and sausages on sticks to cook over charcoal grills. The weather was about 70 degrees, flowers were blooming, Greek music was wafting through the air, and the Ouzo made us all very convivial. There was abundant, well-cooked, fresh food and all the water and wine we wanted. We had to get up by 7am for the city tour included in the price. I usually travel with a good smelling candle to take away stale smoke in lots of European hotel rooms so I lit the candle, turned the radio to Greek music, and drifted off to "sleep fast."

The highlight of the day was the city tour of the Acropolis. I was struck that I was finally here at this imposing, impressive, historic

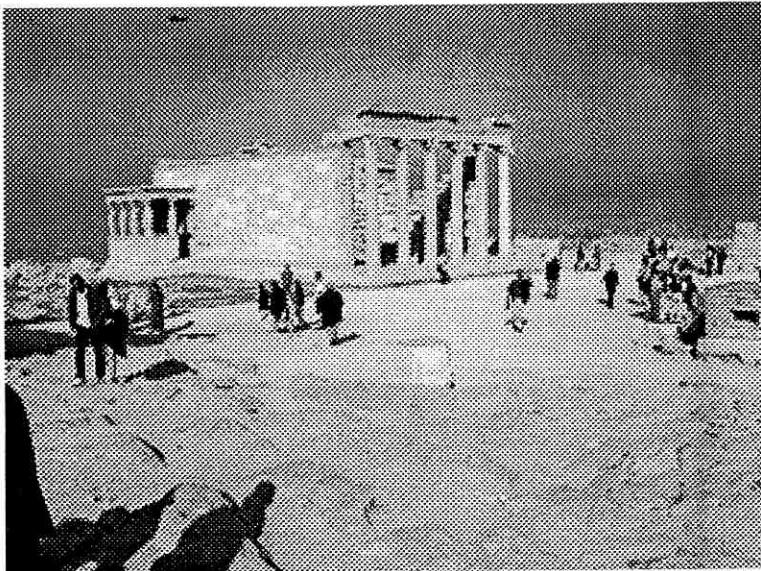
edifice which served as Athena's home while she watched over the city of Athens. The weather was perfect. The marble stairs were uneven and slippery walking. On top, the view looking over the edge of ancient Agora, the theatre of Dionysos, the Plaka, and the heart of current Athens was inspiring. The rest of the city tour was an afterthought to me.

I was up very early for the Delphi tour. Delphi is in the mountains near the Bay of Corinth. Very impressive ruins of Apollo temples and a good museum with many artifacts. The ancient Greeks believed that Delphi was the center of the earth and I loved walking along the sacred Way imagining the high priestess emerging from her sanctuary to pronounce her prophetic, often ambiguous, mutterings.



We didn't arrive at the ship until almost 6pm. Getting on board and finding my cabin was quite confusing. After the mandatory boat drill, dinner was served. (Nobody goes hungry on a cruise!) My dining companions were 4 English people..a couple who were on their 59th cruise! and 2 women traveling together.

First morning on board, I was up early, and went ashore to the very small island of Delos, a waterless atoll that was the religious and commercial center of the Aegean for 1,000 years. The ship went on to dock at Mykonos. There was a small beach and a good-sized

Wednesday, Nov. 1, checked out of the Marmara, took a \$15 taxi ride to the Istanbul airport and flew home.

harbor.

The next morning we arrived at a spectacular island, Santorini. I took the Lost City of Atlantis & Oia Village tour on Santorini.

We ended our tour in Thera where the Ochi Day celebration was taking place.

The next to last morning on board I had breakfast looking out on the magnificent harbor of Rhodes. (Island of Roses) It is part of the Dodecanese island group, located close to the Turkish coast. We went to the Acropolis of Rhodes where we could see Asia Minor across the water.

My last day aboard ship, we arrived early at Kusadasi, Turkey. for a tour of Ephesus. including the 24,000 seat stadium where St. Paul preached. We learned how Turkish rugs were made. I did buy some packets of spices.

On Tuesday, Oct. 31, buses took us on a six-hour tour of Istanbul. We visited the Blue Mosque which is so named for the 21,000 blue-green Iznik tiles which decorate its

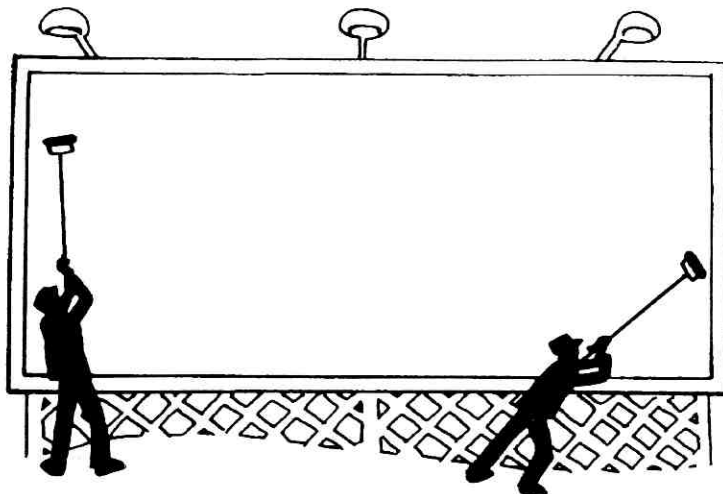
